

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



Welcome to RTC's Newsletter, Reflection on 2022!

This newsletter hopes to provide a window into the events of the year. 2022 has been a great year at RTC, making up for the uncertainties and disruptions we faced in the previous two years.

We began the year with the excitement of the finalisation and launch of the Bachelor of Sports and Health Sciences and the Royal Thimphu College Football Clubs for men and women players. We continue to have a great display of student works and projects, including photos, videos, and research presentations on campus. Students were engaged throughout the year in many exciting co-curricular activities, college plays, sports, music & dance, debates, and quiz competitions. The students also made time for blood drives and voluntary clean-ups in and around Thimphu. Our major national event was co-hosting the Conference on Higher Education Teaching-Learning In Bhutan in July. We also successfully hosted international events including the Vatavaran Film Festival (the biggest Environmental film festival in Asia) and the concluding international hybrid conference of the Erasmus+ FRIENDS project (furthering international relations capacities and intercultural engagement to nurture campus diversity and supporting internationalization at home). We were also inspired by the Distinguished Guest Lecture series, career and international business festivals and celebrations of International day, BLISS (Bhutan Lectures on Innovation, Science and Society), and Bhutan Dialogues sessions hosted at RTC.

We could resume our international student exchanges and mobilities with 65 staff/faculty outbound and 30 reciprocal mobilities between May to October 2022. After a gap of over a year, we picked up on our internationalization programme with 9 international students in the Spring and 16 in the Fall semester, and with 23 RTC students sent for exchange studies in institutes in Europe and the USA for an academic year. Purpose building for the freshmen, leadership orientations, counselling skills and SIY workshops for the student leaders, mock drills for earthquake preparedness, and safety training for fire hazards added to the depth of the care and nurturing of the RTC community. We had a grand graduation day celebration after a gap of two years. The 2022 BCSE (Bhutan Civil Service Examination) result declaration in December was the icing on the cake for a most successful year, as Sonam Tobgay and Karma Wangmo secured the top and the third positions, respectively in the general category. It was indeed a year of achievements for the RTC community.



The EFL course is offered as part of the collaboration project between the two institutes and is expected to build competencies for English language in learners at Tago Institute through a formal EFL course.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP WORKSHOP



Royal Thimphu College Student Leaders, including Student Government officials, Resident Assistants (RAs), and Club Coordinators underwent a two-day Leadership Workshop organized by the Student Services Department and facilitated by the President of RTC, Mr. Tshewang Tandin. The workshop is conducted every semester to help the student leaders develop their leadership and planning skills as they prepare their plan of student activities for the year ahead.

RTC Promotes Access to Inclusive Education

A key element of inclusive education is valuing diversity within the human community. As one of the Higher Education Institutions in Bhutan, Royal Thimphu College has been on a journey to provide and promote inclusive education since 2019 with the enrolment of the first visually impaired student on a full scholarship who successfully graduated in the summer of 2022. RTC welcomed two new students in 2022, Chimi Dema and Sapuna Subba to its newly launched Bachelor of Sports and Health Sciences programme. Chimi and Sapuna are paralympic athletes and have represented Bhutan in many international paralympic games. RTC in partnership with the Bhutan Olympic Committee (BOC) has supported them with full scholarships to pursue their degree studies.

Chimi started her journey as a shotput athlete at the Bhutan Paralympic Committee in 2018 and has since participated in many international paralympic games including the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic games. Sapuna is a para-badminton athlete and has brought home two bronze medals from the Asian Youth Para Games (AYPG). "We were very nervous when we first came to RTC and being surrounded by people we did not know was very overwhelming, but we were able to get along with our classmates and make friends within the first few days. Now we have our own group of friends that we hang out with", said Chimi and Sapuna.

Chimi is currently serving as a part-time gym assistant on campus which gives her the opportunity to earn some monthly allowance from the college. She also helps students using the gym facilities to execute proper form and posture while working out. Sapuna has her badminton practice session every morning at the Multi-purpose Hall with other students. Chimi and Sapuna wish to work at the Bhutan Paralympic Committee after graduating from RTC. "We want to give back to the organization that gave us endless opportunities. We want to advocate for people with disabilities and inspire them to come forward and achieve their dreams."

Inclusive Education goes beyond simply including people with disabilities on campus, we must have a campus-wide effort to build a safe, welcoming, and supportive environment that creates a sense of belonging and respect for diversity. Royal Thimphu College reiterates its commitment to building an inclusive culture on campus and promoting access to education for everyone.



INTERNATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES



In addition to the 23 RTC students studying on one-year academic exchanges to the USA and Europe, Royal Thimphu College was able to send more than 65 teaching and nonteaching staff on short-term outbound mobilities to 13 universities in Europe this Summer. The Erasmus+ programme for higher education funded by the European Union supports teaching and administrative staff to take part in professional development activities every year. The programme allows staff to teach and train abroad, creating an international learning experience for all involved.

The Erasmus+ mobility partnerships and capacity-building projects were initiated in 2017 and involve the exchanges of staff and students between partner universities and long-term project works. The recent mobilities were enriching and fulfilling experiences for all the participants allowing them to explore, engage and learn. It also served as an opportunity for RTC and the host institutions to discuss and plan future collaborative programmes to explore areas for joint academic projects. The mobilities not only contributed to the professional development of the participants but also contributed to the growth of their intercultural competencies. We look forward to future collaborations between the institutions.

Since 2010, RTC has sent over 270 Bhutanese students abroad for short-term and long-term exchanges including cultural and academic mobilities. RTC has also received over 300 international faculty and students for inbound exchanges so far with more already planned for the upcoming year.

Royal Thimphu College Football Club (RTC FC) officially registered as a football club in early 2022. RTC FC conducted the opening ceremony of the Home and Away Kit graced by His Eminence Khenpo on June 2, 2022. Royal Thimphu College celebrated graduation after a two-year hiatus on 30th June 2022! A total of 377 students graduated in 2022 including RTC's first cohort of BSc Nursing and Midwifery students.

International Students





Royal Thimphu College welcomed 9 new international students in the spring semester and 16 new international students in the fall semester of 2022. We were happy to host semester study-abroad students from our partners - Wheaton College Massachusetts, API Study Abroad - Academic Programs International (API), and Centre College in the USA. We also extended a warm welcome to several new independent semester study-abroad students and 2 new full-degree international students from Germany, Netherlands, USA, and India. The College believes that a multicultural environment contributes to the breadth of opportunities for all students, and is a substantial benefit for everyone in terms of cross-cultural learning.

RTC welcomed 556 new students to its nine different programmes including one Continuing Education evening programme, out of which 85 students joined the College on various scholarship schemes offered by RTC and its partner agencies.

RTC COMMUNITY CONTINUES TO GROW

RTC launched a 4-year programme in Sports and Health Sciences in affiliation with the Khesar Gyalpo University of Medical Sciences of Bhutan (KGUMSB). Implemented in the academic year 2022, this is the country's first undergraduate degree programme with a specialization in sports. The programme not only aims to improve the health and physical well-being of the learners, but also aspires to enhance the role that sports can play in boosting social cohesion, for their educational value, and for economic reasons.

From the academic year 2022 onwards, the BA in Development Economics and BA in English Studies at RTC have been updated to 4-year degree programmes to keep up with global trends. Similarly, BA in Mass Communication and BA in Anthropology will be updated to 4-year degree programmes from 2023 onwards.

To mark Energy Week from 23rd to 27th May 2022, the Department of Renewable Energy, Ministry of Economic Affairs (DRE) conducted an advocacy campaign for the development of renewable energy in Bhutan engaging students from BSc in Environmental Management in a quiz competition.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE ON HIGHER EDUCATION



Royal Thimphu College, Paro College of Education and Samtse College of Education co-hosted a National Conference on Higher Education Teaching-Learning in Bhutan in partnership with the Department of Adult and Higher Education from 4th-5th July 2022. The National Conference primarily focused on providing a platform to share innovations, adaptations, and challenges in higher education in recent years; and create space for academics to engage in creative thinking on teaching and learning in higher education. Experts and educators around the country joined the two-day conference to discuss ways forward for the adoption of innovative and adaptive practices.

RTC Associate Professor and Programme Leader of Political Science and Sociology, Dr. Jelle J.P. Wouters is the author and editor of 9 books. These include Vernacular Politics in Northeast India (Oxford University Press), Nagapolis: A Community Portrait (Barkweaver Press), Subaltern Studies 2.0: Being Against the Capitalocene (Chicago University Press/Prickly Paradigm Press, co-authored with Milinda Banerjee), and The Routledge's Handbook of Highland Asia (edited with Michael Heneise), and The Routledge's Companion to Northeast India (edited with Tanka B. Subba). Over the years, he also published over 40 peer-reviewed articles and book chapters. He has been a monthly columnist for the Statesman and a regular contributor to other newspapers, magazines, and online outlets.

In 2021, the HCEH hosted an international seminar, conducted online, titled: 'Storying Climes of the Himalaya, Andes, and Arctic' which brought together scholars from places across the globe. This conference is culminating in a book titled: Storying Multipolar Climes of the Himalaya, Andes, and Arctic: Anthropocenic Climate and Shapeshifting Watery Lifewords (edited by Dr. Jelle and Dan Smyer Yü, Routledge 2023). Currently, the HCEH is engaged in two main research projects, Multispecies Himalayan Climes, funded by the Centre's main institutional partner: ICIMOD-HUC, and More-Than-Human Conversations in Bhutan. Both these projects involve a range of RTC faculty, staff, and students.

Dr. Jelle studied anthropology in Amsterdam, Oxford, and Shillong and taught at Sikkim Central University, India, and Eberhard Karls University of Tübingen, Germany before joining Royal Thimphu College in 2015. He currently serves as the chair of the Himalayan Centre for Environmental Humanities (HCEH), which was established at Royal Thimphu College in 2021 to promote humanist and more-than-human understandings of ecology and climate, and to engage in, variously, bridgebuilding, line-drawing, dot-connecting, and co-creating between climate science, other sciences, humanities, policy-makers, and the public. The HCEH is also primarily engaged in capacity-building in the Environmental Humanities among faculty, staff, and students through

Royal Thimphu College, in collaboration with Erasmus+ funded project Encore EU, inaugurated its Entrepreneurship Knowledge Centre (EKC) on 19th October 2022. EKC is an incubation centre to foster Innovative Entrepreneurship Practices in Education and Research. The centre has been equipped with IT facilities and will collaborate with stakeholders like Loden Foundation and FabLab Bhutan to promote innovation in the field of entrepreneurship. ENCORE is a three-year Erasmus+ Capacity Building in Higher Education project co-financed by the European Commission.

Royal Thimphu College celebrated International Day and Business Festival on 19th October 2022.



His Excellency also toured the campus and had a short interaction with the executive members and programme leaders of RTC.



The 53rd Bhutan Dialogues was held at the Royal Thimphu College, a special session on Science, Inner Transformation, and Buddhism in the Modern World by Matthieu Ricard on 10th November 2022. Matthieu Ricard brings together ancient wisdom and scientific insights to put forth a truly compelling global vision for the 21st century, and his voice, his message and his wisdom are greatly needed.



Officials representing various sectors working towards harnessing and providing clean energy in Bhutan spoke to the final year and Environmental Management students of RTC. The three guest speakers Mr. Ugyen Norbu (Chief Program Officer, RSTA), Mr. Galey Wangchuk (CEO, Suntch Bhutan), and Ms. Dechen Dema (Executive Engineer, Department of Renewable Energy, MoEA) spoke on the topics of electrifying the transportation sector, energy saving through advanced technologies, and alternative renewable energy sources in Bhutan. The guest lectures were part of Bhutan Lectures on Innovation, Science and Society (BLISS), a public benefit event that aims to bring forward transformative ideas by Bhutanese to a wider audience in order to inform, educate. empower and inspire people.





Royal Thimphu College was honored to have His Excellency Lyonpo Sonam Tobgay, former chief justice of Bhutan as a guest speaker on 25th August 2022. His Excellency spoke about Bhutan's Transition to Democracy. The talk was attended by the College President, international students from Wheaton College, and students from the Political Science and Sociology programme.

Dr. Phub Tshering (Onco Surgeon, JDWNRH) and Ms. Anu Rai from Bhutan Cancer Society ran an advocacy programme on Cancer Awareness. Dr. Phub and Ms. Anu introduced Bhutan Cancer Society and spoke about the ill effects of tobacco to first-year students. Bhutan Cancer Society intends to scale up this initiative and reach out to more schools and students to share the adverse effects of tobacco use.

DISASTER RISK REDUCTION AWARENESS PROGRAMME



Royal Thimphu College held a Disaster Risk Reduction Awareness Programme on 9th November with the support of the Department of Disaster Management and Fire and Rescue Service Division of the Royal Bhutan Police. The programme started off with a campus-wide mock earthquake drill followed by a guest lecture by an official from the Department of Disaster Management. Mr. Chimi Dorji (Sr. Program Officer) gave a talk on Disaster Preparedness and Risk Reduction focused on fire prevention since fire hazards increase around this time of the year. Simultaneously, training on fire safety and management was conducted by the officials from the Royal Bhutan Police for the front-line staff and student representatives. The training included a demonstration of using fire extinguishers and handling LPG cylinders.

RTC LAUNCHES THE PEARSON VUE TEST CENTER



Royal Thimphu College successfully launched the Pearson VUE Test Center and conducted the first **Professional Education for SAI Auditors** - **Pilot (PESA-P) Assessment** on September 20th, 2022. From introductory to expert level, the Pearson VUE Test Center has the tools to help participants take the next step in their certification pathway. The center has access to the world's most recognized learning providers to offer a multi-modal training and testing solution featuring e-Learning materials, study guides, practice tests, and certification vouchers that will help increase exam pass rates and job performance.

Royal Thimphu College—University of Minnesota (USA) Collaboration on Accessibility and Inclusion in Bhutanese Higher Education





Royal Thimphu College in collaboration with the University of Minnesota (USA), organized a workshop on Accessibility and Inclusion in Bhutanese Higher Education on 18th October 2022. The workshop primarily focused on building knowledge and further understanding of inclusive higher education strategies and practices in the Bhutanese higher education and TVET sectors, emphasizing high-impact low-cost initiatives. The participants of the workshop were persons from higher education in Bhutan – university, colleges, technical training institutes, also including upper secondary schools involved in the transition to higher education. The workshop was coordinated by Dr. Matt Schuelka and Dr. Chris Johnstone from the University of Minnesota and Ura Sonam Tshewang (Grants Coordinator, RTC).

Phurpa Tshering graduated with a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science and Sociology in July 2018. He was one of the recipients of the Department of Adult and Higher Education (DAHE) scholarship. While in his 2nd year and final year of college at RTC, he served as a Resident Assistant (RA) and also served as a Teaching Assistant for Dzongkha communication to the international students. Phurpa also received the prestigious 'Outstanding Contribution to Student Life' award during his time at RTC. "RTC is my light in the darkness. I was a young village boy who had not traveled beyond my own district and could only see the rest of the world only after I came to RTC. I had the great privilege of participating in a cultural exchange programme to Japan as a young goodwill ambassador. I also got the opportunity to participate in Nepal Padyadtra on behalf of the Spiritual Club at the college. Besides academic achievements, I could also get wholesome experiences in leadership, management, interpersonal relationships, and cultural aspects."

Phurpa remains deeply grateful to RTC as it played a significant role in his entire learning journey. He said that he had the privilege to learn under highly qualified tutors and had the opportunity to study with both Bhutanese and international students in one place. He added that being in the RTC community significantly enhanced his interpersonal communication skills and work ethic. It shaped him into a more confident person. Phurpa appeared Bhutan Civil Service Examination and qualified for the civil service. For a year, he worked as an assistant immigration officer with the Department of Immigration. Currently, he works as a researcher with the Center for Bhutan and GNH Studies, Thimphu.

FRIENDS Project is the first Erasmus+ Capacity Building Project for RTC. With the end of the project, the College has been able to improve the capabilities for internationalization through staff training and creating general awareness. Also, the promotion of virtual mobility and campus diversity has been prioritized for global competence development.
